Dear Parents/Caregivers

We are looking forward to our Middle and Senior School Surf Carnival for 2021. Students will be competing in their year level House groups throughout the day. The teachers, under the direction of Mr Andrew Palumbo and Mr Peter Daish, have prepared an excellent program of Carnival events. Activities include beach volleyball, rescue race, boogie board competition, paddle race, free swim, traditional flags competition and many others.

It is important that students be adequately protected from the sun and wind, as they will be on the beach and in and out of the water all day. With this in mind, we have provided some information to help clarify the uniform expectations on the day and to provide adequate protection:

- College Sports shorts with a House colour t-shirt is preferred for events
- It is also required that students wear "rashie" style tops over their bathers in the water
- Footwear suitable for the beach (thongs/sandals are acceptable footwear)
- College school hat
- College rugby top

As this is a major College event, casual clothes - especially tank tops and singlets - are NOT permitted, as they provide little sun protection.

**It is very important that students bring:**

- sunscreen
- a packed lunch or money to purchase food and drink from Rotary Club barbecue
- snacks
- plenty of water to drink

**Students who are NOT competing will be required to wear College Sports uniform and act as marshals and scorers throughout the day.** In the afternoon the finals will be held in true carnival style. Finals in the beach volleyball, flags, rescues and team ironman (run, paddle and swim) will be the highlight of the day.

All students, including Year 12 students, will travel to the Carnival and back via bus. Buses will leave the College at 9:00am and will return in time for students to catch their normal buses home.

Students begin the day in their home group and travel to and from Horseshoe Bay on the buses provided. Students may not remain at the beach unless the home group teacher is notified by a parent/caregiver **prior to the day**.

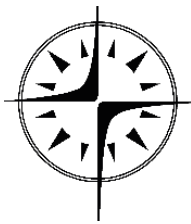
