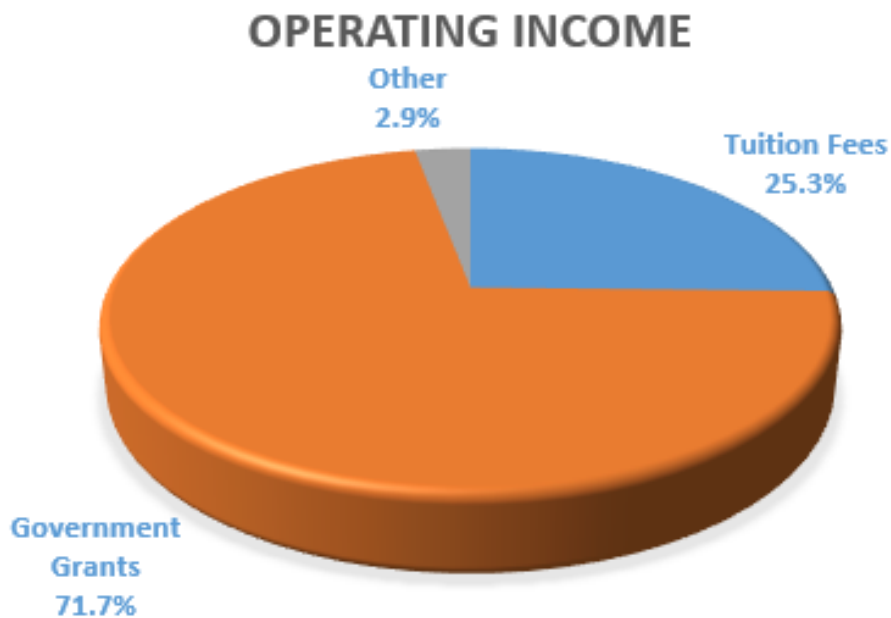
**b. Non-attendance Management**

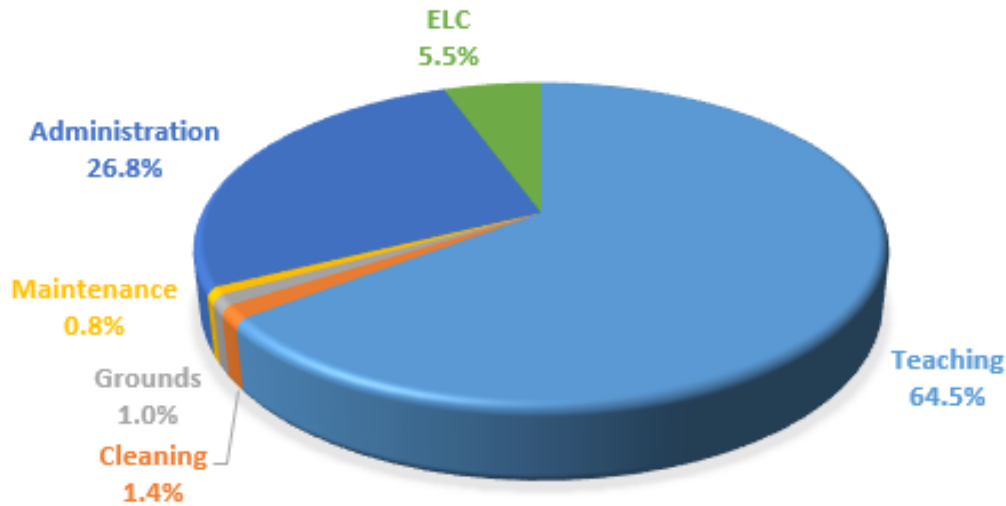

Investigator College students have again excelled in the final Year 12 results. Staff and students waited with anticipation to see the results which not only reflect the pressures of a hectic Year 12, but which also represent the culmination of 13 years of schooling.

The College's Dux is Alicia Crowhurst, whose ATAR was an incredible 98.65! One quarter of our university seekers achieved an ATAR above 90 and their average ATAR score was above 75. Further to this, a staggering 28% of assessment grades achieved were in the A band with 75% in the A and B bands!
