JUNIOR SCHOOL

Our Junior School program is challenging and exciting for students from Reception to Year 6. Across the year levels the curriculum is diverse and broadly based. It encourages the pursuit of academic excellence, yet caters for individual differences in learning styles and abilities. It meets the students' intellectual needs, yet satisfies their physical and emotional needs. Through English, Science, HASS (Humanities and Social Sciences), Mathematics, Japanese, Health and Physical Education, Technologies (Design Technologies and Digital Technologies), Wellbeing and Values Education (WAVE), The Arts (Dance, Drama, Visual, Media and Music) and leisure-time activities, students are encouraged to become confident, active, resilient, self-reliant and successful lifelong learners.

MIDDLE SCHOOL

All Middle School students encounter a wide variety of subjects offered in order to broaden experience and place students in a position to be able to make informed decisions about their subject choices in their Senior School years. Throughout Middle School, students study a range of core subjects and are progressively given the option of selecting from specialist subjects.

Aside from the core areas such as Mathematics, English, Science, History and SOSE, students enjoy a variety of subjects as they move through their Middle Schooling years including ICT, Performing Arts, Physical Education, Food and Hospitality, Agriculture, Art, Wood Technology, and more...

THE RITE JOURNEY - YEAR 9

The Rite Journey provides a unique educational program designed to support the development of self-aware, vital, responsible, respectful and resilient adults.

By raising young people's consciousness about transitioning from child to adult and having conversations with them about what really matters, we can assist in guiding their journey into adulthood.

The year-long program uses a Rites of Passage framework to deepen the students' experience of this important life transition.



SENIOR SCHOOL

Moreover, families can expect the College to have a real interest in and respect for each individual Senior School student and their journey as both a student and emerging young adult.

Within 'Investigator Senior', our stand alone, purpose-built space, senior students have the use of state-of-the-art classrooms, laboratories, food technology facilities and art studios. Informal meeting spaces encourage collaborative learning and peer support.

Most students are aware of their own strengths and weaknesses and their likes and dislikes. With the support and guidance of teachers, students are provided with all of the information necessary to decide which subjects will help them fulfil their ambitions.

Important information sessions are held throughout the year. These events, along with the Head Start Program, provide families with a chance to gain an understanding of the subject selection process, subject workloads and prerequisites. At Investigator College, students encounter a wide variety of subjects offered in order to broaden experience and place them in a position to be able to make informed decisions about their subject choices.

In Years 11 and 12, students study fewer core subjects and more specialised subjects. In Year 11, many Stage 1 subjects are offered as both Full Year and Single Semester subjects. By undertaking a range of Single Semester specialist subjects, Year 11 students have the opportunity to develop a firm understanding of the expectations, content and suitability of the Stage 2 courses. Should parents, caregivers or students have concerns about subject selection, please make a time to meet with the College SACE or VET Coordinator.

Additionally, the College coordinates a number of exclusive opportunities for Senior School students to meet with tertiary advisors and guest speakers. One such opportunity is the Investigator College Fleurieu Tertiary Studies and Careers Day which is held annually. At this trade show-style event, students and parents can review a range of information regarding educational pathways offered through TAFE, university, Australian Defence Forces, Housing Industry of Australia and more...

WELLBEING

At Investigator College we acknowledge that wellbeing and school achievement are inextricably linked.

Our students and staff focus on character strengths, resiliency, gratitude and growth mindsets to ensure that both student and staff wellbeing is at the forefront, enabling optimum academic, sporting and cultural outcomes.

Positive Education is not only taught explicitly but is embedded into the very fabric of our College. Excellent manners and pro-social skills are hallmarks of an Investigator student with a strong emphasis on respect: of ourselves, of others, the environment and of animals. The culture is calm, caring and focused.

Each student is a member to a Home Group and the teacher in charge is the contact point for parents and caregivers. As the key pastoral carer, they develop nurturing relationships with the students in their care, providing a welcoming smile each morning. It must be reassuring to know that any emotional, social or academic issues can be addressed immediately and effectively by someone who knows your child well.

The College is comprised of four outstanding sub-schools, each with its own leaders and special 'family' character. Importantly, students and families know they have the back-up of an excellent counselling team led by two qualified counsellors.



SCHOOL FEES AND FINANCES

Families who seek to confirm their enrolment at Investigator College need to have a clear understanding of the financial commitment associated with their decision.

FEES

Full tuition fees apply to the first child from a family attending the College and fee reductions apply for the second and subsequent children. Please refer to the enclosed Fee Schedule brochure.

The fees are set each year by the College Board following consideration of delivery costs and any anticipated increase in these costs.

Material fees apply to some subjects and are charged separately from Tuition Fees in the semester to which they apply.

The College offers flexible options for the payment of school fees. The payment agreement form distributed in November of each year outlines available payment options.

CAPITAL DEVELOPMENT LEVY

Investigator College is still in the process of establishing its buildings and resources. It is essential that the cost of acquiring these important facilities be shared between current and future students. Families are required to contribute to a Capital Development Levy to provide such facilities.



GENERAL INFORMATION

ADMINISTRATION AND GOVERNANCE

The College is governed by the College Board. The role of the Board is to approve Policy for the College in the areas of Strategic Planning, Finance, Property and Grounds, and Development. The day-to-day operations of the College are the sole responsibility of the Principal.


UNIFORM

STARTING YOUR LEARNING JOURNEY AT INVESTIGATOR COLLEGE...

Investigator College is committed to lifelong learning and places a high value on the importance of Early Childhood Education.

Most children are best served by completing four full terms of kindergarten (Early Learning) prior to commencing in Reception. Your child can be enrolled at 'Little Investigators' Early Learning Centre from three years of age.

Investigator College follows the State Government policy where children that turn five before 1 May will start Reception at the beginning of Term 1 in that year.


Children who turn five on or after 1 May and before the commencement of Term 3 of that year will have the opportunity to commence Reception mid-year, and to complete six terms of Reception or alternatively, students can start Reception at the beginning of Term 1 the following year.
